Sociocultural theory, also known as social constructivism or socioculturalism, is defined by educational scholars as: Nagel (2012, p. 83) argues that sociocultural theory “reflects the view that learning and development is not just a process of increased mental sophistication but is also mediated through social and cultural interactions.”

Sociocultural theory grew from the work of seminal psychologist Lev Vygotsky, who believed that

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parents, caregivers, peers, and the culture at large were responsible for developing higher-order functions. According to Vygotsky, learning has its basis in interacting with other people.

In the context of technology-enhanced environments, the emergence of new synchronous and asynchronous communication technologies and increased attention to computer-supported collaborative learning (CSCL) and virtual communities of practice create new opportunities for applying sociocultural methodologies, as their affordances allow quality collaboration and new ways of interacting in face-to-face, blended, and online environments (Garrison & Akyol, 2013).
