One thing that almost everyone agrees on is that the two books (or sets of two books each) were written at different times by different people.

The Relationship between the Books of Kings and Chronicles

A careful study of the genealogies provided in the first 9 chapters of Chronicles provides the following information: There are 886 male names, 25 female names, and 25 names for nations or people groups.

Abstract. The genealogies of 1 Chronicles 1-9 have typically been viewed as the work of a redactor or redactors with no internal consistency, purpose or plan, and little, if any, relation to the narrative portions of Chronicles. In contrast to these opinions, this study shows that the genealogical section of the Chronicler's work is an ordered, well structured, unified whole.
