NYS Universal Prekindergarten Program (UPK) The Office of Early Learning provides oversight and technical support to school districts in the development, implementation and evaluation of programs and policies related to educating students in prekindergarten to third grade that are aligned with the NYS Board of Regents Early Childhood Policy.

18 VIRGINIA JOURNAL OF EDUCATION Children (NAEYC) defines pre-K as “a distinct group of programs designed specifically to make sure that preschool- ers are ready for kindergarten and will

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be succeeding in school by third grade,” and specifies three key characteristics: (1) high program standards, (2) serve four-year-olds, and sometimes also three-year-olds, and (3) focus on school readiness.

Universal Pre-K: What We Know, What We Need

West Virginia Pre-K Standards (Ages 3-5)

Section 3602-e of Education Law has been amended to require that all school districts receiving any State and/or federal prekindergarten grant must adopt approved quality indicators within two years, including, but not limited to, valid and reliable measures of environmental quality, the quality of teacher-student interactions and student outcomes.

You must accept your pre-K offer by pre-registering with the program where you got the offer. Pre-registration secures your child's pre-K seat at that program. Contact the program to schedule a time to pre-register in person. Be sure to accept your offer even if you are waitlisted at another program.

Order Requiring Universal Face Coverings. On July 1, 2020, the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Health announced an Order Requiring Universal Face Coverings. The order, signed under Secretary Levine's authority under the Disease Prevention and Control Act, outlines the situations when a mask must be worn and includes limited exceptions to the face-covering requirement.

Yes, if a district identifies 15 or more eligible children who are four years of age on or before September 1 of the current school year. A school district may offer prekindergarten classes if the district identifies 15 or more eligible children who are at least three years of age. TEC §29.153 (a-1) 2.

Universal pre-kindergarten allows all children the chance to acquire these skills and provides parents with the means to enroll their children in preschool regardless of their financial situation. Because a universal program is implemented through school districts, children who attend this type of preschool will be able to interact and form friendships with their neighborhood peers at an early age .

Georgia's Pre-K Program is a lottery funded educational program for Georgia's four year olds to prepare children for Kindergarten. Who is eligible for Georgia's Pre-K Program? Children four years of age on September 1 of the current school year who are Georgia residents are eligible to attend Georgia's Pre-K Program during this school year.

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
